Prayer Points

As we look together at Paul's letter to the Colossians over the next few weeks, let's ask that God will take what was written to a local church centuries ago and speak to us through it as a local church today.

Let's pray for our neighbours and people on estates local to the church, that God will continue to give us compassion and wisdom as we seek to relate to people in need of Jesus.

The Baptist Missionary Society asks us to pray for Bangladesh this week. Sheikh Hasina and the Awami League were elected to government at the beginning of the year following years of military rule in Bangladesh. They have an opportunity to demonstrate wisdom, honesty and a fair government for all the peoples of Bangladesh, regardless of ethnicity or religion, though it will not be easy to maintain peace and stability. We are asked to pray: (1) that government leaders will work for the good of all, taking a long-term view of what is needed to improve everyday life for the people; (2) for strength and grace for Les and Fiona Allan, working hard to build relationships in their community and with local churches; (3) for wisdom for the Bangladesh Baptist Church Union and its outreach to previously untouched groups through evangelism and development work.
